Membership 2024

As I am sure you will all appreciate, we have outgoings all year round, particularly this time of year because of affiliation fees to Bowls Surrey and Bowls England on top of the usual club expenses. This is a long-winded introduction which is probably unnecessary, as your 2024 subscription is no doubt on its way to our treasurer Carole Mlinaric. Many thanks to those of you who have already paid their subs.

The form at the back of the Newsletter isn't really compulsory unless your circumstances have changed e.g phone number, email address etc.

Details of the coming season will gradually appear on our web site so have a browse when you have time. Alan Eveleigh is our Safeguarding Officer, and his responsibilities will be found on the web site.

The Centre Outside

The green upkeep never stops, and our new green keeper David Webb has settled in, together with Simon Clarke our green steward. The mowers have been away for servicing, and we have had to purchase a new brusher, as the other one broke. The irrigation system has been serviced ready for watering when needed.

Hopefully by the time we start bowling there will be a new boundary fence between us and the car park. The one being replaced is well over 20 years old and beginning to need serious attention, so it was felt better to have a new one built. A local firm, Rudgwick Fencing will be doing the work which is being paid for by a generous grant from Ewhurst Parish Council.

We are also having to replace the decking on the north and east side of the green and at the same time fitting vertical side boards to match the ones already installed on the other two sides. We have applied for a grant from Surrey Playing Fields Association for the cost, or at least for some of the materials, and hope to get a favourable response soon.

The Clubhouse

Mike Crowther and his team look after the clubhouse and there has been a lot of work done which you probably wouldn't even notice. An emergency exit door and balustrade needed repairing, the alarm system needed attention, the front door keypad had to be fixed, the outside lighting needed an electrician, a water heater in the gent's toilet was replaced and a new flushing system is about to be installed. Together with the short mat club, we are investigating whether to introduce a contactless card payment system for the bar, so you may or may not see that being introduced. This will not replace cash entirely, although some clubs are moving that way.

Bottle Tops

Don't forget milk bottle tops are being collected for charity. There is a collection box in the kitchen.


