Green Surrounds and Fence

You will all have noticed by now the new fence between the car park and the green. The Bowls Centre is responsible for the surrounds of the property which we lease from the Parish Council. However, we did apply to the Council for a grant for the cost of the fence and they generously agreed to grant us the money for it. We did obtain 4 quotes and the best was from a local firm, Rudgwick Fencing, who did a great job, so anyone needing fencing, talk to Adrian at Rudgwick Fencing.

The green surrounds and decking on the north and east sides of the green have been renewed and Jon Koefman, our previous green keeper together with Simon Clarke our green steward, have done a grand job. You may recall we did get a grant from Surrey County Council via our local County Councillor Liz Townsend for both the green surrounds and the new shed. We also obtained a grant from the Surrey Playing Fields Association which helped to pay for the decking.

Even early in the season we have interest from new members, and Jennifer Parsons and Michael Hardesty have already joined us. If you see faces you do not know, please introduce yourselves and make them welcome, as I am sure they will have queries about how the club operates.
