
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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WHAT IS THE TITLE OF THE MOVIE DESCRIBED BELOW?

59. In Victorian England, the independent and headstrong Bathsheba Everdene attracts three very different suitors: Gabriel Oak, a sheep farmer; Frank Troy, a reckless Sergeant; and William Boldwood, a prosperous and mature bachelor.
60. Katniss Everdeen voluntarily takes her younger sister's place in a game: a televised competition in which two teenagers from each of the twelve Districts of Panem are chosen at random to fight to the death.
61. The life of a simple bookshop owner changes when he meets the most famous film star in the world.

69. Struggling boutique bookseller Kathleen Kelly hates Joe Fox the owner of a corporate Foxbooks chain store that just moved in across the street. When they meet online, however, they begin an intense and anonymous Internet romance, oblivious of each other's true identity.
70. Belle, a village girl, embarks on a journey to save her father from a creature that has locked him in his dungeon. Eventually, she learns that the creature is an enchanted prince who has been cursed.

72. Ennis and Jack, two shepherds in the mountains of Wyoming, develop a sexual and emotional relationship. Their relationship becomes complicated when both of them get married to their respective girlfriends.

73. The life of a coal miner's son in Northern England, is forever changed one day when he stumbles upon a ballet class during his weekly boxing lesson.

74. A Thracian gladiator who, along with Crixus, Gannicus, Castus, and Oenomaus, is an escaped slave leader in the Third Servile War, a major slave uprising against the Roman Republic.

THE FOLLOWING ARE BRIEF OPERA STORY LINES. CAN YOU IDENTIFY THE OPERA?

1. This tells the story of the tragic love between the courtesan Violetta and the romantic Alfredo. Played out against the hypocrisy of upper-class fashionable society, Alfredo and Violetta's love threatens to shame his family.

2. This tragic love story of Mimí and Rodolfo, is set in Paris in 1830. Four arty types shiver in a garret, owing rent. When one of their number, musician Schaunard, earns money they are all set to buy a meal in a nearby restaurant.

3. This tells the story of Tamino, a prince who must undergo a series of tests, accompanied by his goofy sidekick in order to marry the princess Pamina. Alongside the priest Sarastro, Tamino, Papageno, and Pamina battle Pamina's mother, the evil and mysterious Queen of the Night.

4. Count Almaviva, a Spanish nobleman, is in love with Rosina, the rich ward of Dr Bartolo, an old physician, who plans to marry her himself. Unfortunately, the serenade produces no response from Rosina, so Almaviva enlists the help of Figaro, who prides himself on his ability to manage the affairs of the city.

5. This political thriller is set in Rome during the Napoleonic wars. The plot centres around three main characters – Rome's diva Floria, her lover - a painter and republican, and the corrupt Chief of Police, Baron Scarpia.

6. A beautiful and brutal princess challenges her many suitors to answer three riddles on pain of death. No one has ever succeeded. Calaf is a brave, selfish prince from a different land, who watches the princess behead a rival suitor and falls instantly in love.

7. This story by American lawyer and writer John Luther Long is based on the recollections of Long's sister, Jennie Correll, who had been to Japan with her husband, a Methodist missionary, and was influenced by Pierre Loti's novel *Madam Chrysanthème*.

8. This opera begins on a street in Venice, in the midst of an argument between Roderigo, a rich man, and Iago. Roderigo has been paying Iago to help him in his suit to Desdemona. But Roderigo has just learned that Desdemona has married a general whom Iago begrudgingly serves as ensign.

9. A servant to a count is about to marry Susanna, the maid of a countess. The count catches him alone with the gardener's daughter, Barbarina, and he is now to be sent away. He is besotted by all women, he explains, and cannot help himself.

10. He is a jester in the court of the Duke of Mantua. He has a hunch-back and he's rather unattractive, but he's good at his job of humiliating the courtiers for the amusement of the Duke. The courtiers, of course, are not amused.
11. The nephew of King Mark of Cornwall ventures to Ireland to ask the hand of a princess for his uncle, and, having slain a dragon that is devastating the country, succeeds in his mission.
12. The title character, a wild Spanish gypsy, is unscrupulous in matters of the law and of the heart. ... A knife fight breaks out between him and another woman, and José is ordered to arrest the gypsy.
13. This musical drama focuses on some poverty-stricken residents struggling to survive in the Charleston tenement of Catfish Row. The sultry "B" becomes the object of desire of "P" a disabled man who gets around in a cart. But "B" is also involved with a thuggish Crown and a drug dealer Sportin' Life. Crown kills a man and goes into hiding. "B" seeks shelter with "P". But when Crown returns "P" must take a stand.
14. This classic story concerns a renowned musician who is so distraught over the death of his wife, Eurydice, that he attempts to rescue her from the place of the dead.
15. Set in Ancient Egypt, this is a timeless story of love and betrayal against the backdrop of war. The story is a roller coaster of emotions told through some powerful music. The heroine is an Ethiopian princess held captive in Egypt, in love with a General, Radames, and he with her.

NAME THE BATTLE/WAR DESCRIBED BELOW

1. This campaign was the land-based element of a strategy intended to allow Allied ships to pass through the Dardanelles, capture Constantinople (now Istanbul) and ultimately knock Ottoman Turkey out of the war. But Allied plans were based on the mistaken belief that the Ottomans could be easily overcome.
2. This battle, fought in Pennsylvania, was between Union and Confederate forces during the American Civil War. The battle involved the largest number of casualties of the entire war and is often described as the war's turning point.
3. This epic battle marked the final defeat of Napoleon Bonaparte, who conquered much of Europe in the early 19th century.
4. The English King was defeated by the Norman forces of William the Conqueror. By the end of the bloody, all-day battle, the King was dead and his forces destroyed. He was the last Anglo-Saxon king of England, and the battle changed the course of history and established the Normans as the rulers of England.
5. Russians consider this to be one of the greatest battles of their Great Patriotic War, and most historians consider it to be the greatest battle of the entire conflict. It stopped the German advance into the Soviet Union and marked the turning of the tide of war in favour of the Allies.
6. Outnumbered and outmanoeuvred, when Henry V won the Battle it was a famous victory in the Hundred Years War between the English and the French - and it was all because of the humble longbow.
7. This was the last significant battle of the Wars of the Roses, which extended across England in the latter half of the 15th century. Fought on 22 August the battle was won by the Lancastrians.

8. Part of Operation Iceberg, this was the last major battle of World War II, and one of the bloodiest. On Easter Sunday 1945 the Navy's Fifth Fleet and more than 180,000 U.S. Army and U.S. Marine Corps troops descended on a Pacific island for a final push towards Japan.
9. In January 1879, a British garrison of just over a hundred men – including sick and wounded – defended a hastily-fortified mission station from thousands of battle-hardened Zulu warriors. The successful defence against all odds has caused many to regard this battle as one of the greatest in British history.
10. Fought on June 14th 1645 this battle was a decisive engagement during the First English Civil War between the Royalist army of King Charles I and the Parliamentarian Army commanded by Sir Thomas Fairfax and Oliver Cromwell. It marked the beginning of the end for the clan system in the Highlands of Scotland
11. This battle marked the beginning of the end for the Axis in North Africa. Field Marshal Erwin Rommel was comprehensively defeated by the British Eighth Army, and Allied material superiority meant that he had little chance of rallying his broken forces.
12. During the first Indochina war, this was a struggle between French and Vietnamese Communist and nationalist forces for control of a small mountain outpost on the Vietnamese border near Laos. The Viet Minh victory in this battle effectively ended the eight-year-old war.
13. Fought about 60 miles off the coast of Denmark in 1916 this was the only major encounter between the main British and German battle fleets.
14. This was a decisive naval battle in the Pacific Theatre of World War II which took place six months after Japan's attack on Pearl Harbour and one month after the Battle of the Coral Sea.
15. This was a battle in between the forces of the deposed King James II of England and Ireland, VII of Scotland and those of King William III who, with his wife Queen Mary II, had acceded to the Crowns of England and Scotland in 1689.
16. This battle marked the first major Royalist defeat in the English Civil Wars. Two years after the outbreak of civil war in England, King Charles I was on the defensive in the north. A Royalist army was besieged in York by a Parliamentary army now supported by Scottish allies. The decisive battle gave Parliament full control of the north.
17. This was a global war fought between 1756 and 1763. It involved all five European great powers of the time plus many of the middle powers and spanned five continents, affecting Europe, the Americas, West Africa, India, and the Philippines.
18. This battle is considered by some criteria as the final battle of the American Civil War. It was fought May 12 and 13, 1865, on the banks of the Rio Grande east of Brownsville, Texas and a few miles from the seaport of Los Brazos de Santiago.
19. The Charge of the Light Brigade was a failed military action between the British Light Cavalry and Russian forces during this battle.
20. *Who said this: "Death is nothing, but to live defeated and inglorious is to die daily".*

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WHAT IS THE TITLE OF THESE PLAYS BY WILLIAM SHAKESPEARE?

- 1.** The ghost of the King of Denmark tells his son to avenge his murder by killing the new king, His son feigns madness, contemplates life and death, and seeks revenge. His uncle, fearing for his life, also devises a murderous plot of his own.
- 2.** Iago, a Venetian soldier and ensign, is passed over for promotion by a Moorish nobleman who has reached the pinnacle of his career: he is general of the Venetian army and has secretly married Desdemona, daughter of an important statesman in Venice.
- 3.** A play about magic, betrayal, love and forgiveness. It is set on an island somewhere near Italy where Prospero, the one-time Duke of Milan, and his beautiful daughter, Miranda, live with a sprite called Ariel and a strange wildman called Caliban.
- 4.** This play opens with Theseus and Hippolyta planning their wedding, which takes place in four days. Egeus enters with his daughter, Hermia, and her two suitors, Lysander and Demetrius. ... He declares that if Hermia won't marry Demetrius, she will die.
- 5.** Antonio, an antisemitic tradesman, takes a loan from the Jew Shylock to help his friend to court Portia. Antonio can't repay the loan, and without mercy, Shylock demands a pound of his flesh. The heiress Portia, now the wife of Antonio's friend, dresses as a lawyer and saves Antonio.
- 6.** Viola, separated from her twin Sebastian, dresses as a boy and works for the Duke Orsino, whom she falls in love with. Orsino is in love with the Countess Olivia, and sends Viola to court her for him, but Olivia falls for Viola instead. Sebastian arrives, causing a flood of mistaken identity, and marries Olivia. Viola then reveals she is a girl and marries Orsino.

- 7.** Lucentio loves Bianca but cannot court her until her shrewish older sister Katherina marries. The eccentric Petruccio marries the reluctant Katherina and uses a number of tactics to render her an obedient wife. Lucentio marries Bianca and, in a contest at the end, Katherina proves to be the most obedient wife.
- 8.** A Roman politician and General is captivated by the Queen of Egypt. Gossip and scandal leads to plots of murder and battles. The General, Octavius Caesar and Lepidus, having defeated Julius Caesar's assassins at Philippi, now rule the Roman Empire as a triumvirate.
- 9.** The jealous King Leontes falsely accuse his wife Hermione of infidelity with his best friend, and she dies. Leontes exiles his newborn daughter Perdita, who is raised by shepherds for sixteen years and falls in love with the son of Leontes' friend. When Perdita returns home, a statue of Hermione "comes to life", and everyone is reconciled.
- 10.** Falstaff decides to fix his financial woe by seducing the wives of two wealthy merchants. The wives find he sent them identical letters and take revenge by playing tricks on Falstaff when he comes calling. With the help of their husbands and friends, the wives play one last trick in the woods to put Falstaff's mischief to an end.
